WELFARE RIGHTS ADVICE PROJECT

Hear Us has been providing peer support with Welfare Benefits claims for over 10 Years, We can assist you with:

Personal Independence Payment (PIP) claims.

Universal Credit (UC) claim, which is replacing 6 other benefits with a single monthly payment.

We can also help you to apply for **Freedom Passes** and other concessionary transport schemes.

We can also support you with access to **food banks.**

We can assist with applying for **grants** to help with utility (water, gas and electricity) debts.

We can assist by accompanying you to your medical assessments, supporting you to appeal and ask for a **Mandatory Reconsideration (MR) and where necessary, support you at tribunals**.

LINKWORKING PROJECT

Hear Us has been supporting service users since 2007 to navigate and gain the most out of Croydon's statutory and voluntary mental health services.

Our peer support Linkworkers visit the inpatient wards at the Royal Bethlem Hospital and Croydon's Mental Health Community Services, Jeanette Wallace House and Queens Resource Centre.

Our Linkworkers have lived experience of mental illness and are current and former service users. They can offer a safe space to talk about any issues without the fear of reprisal.

Referral and signposting - We can point people in the right direction to get help by referring them to services and organisations that can help them, or by providing details of where they can get further support.

Our project aims to improve services based on service users' honest feedback.

REACHOUT CHALLENGE

We all have mental health needs. Life is about having a good balance of mental and physical wellbeing.

The Reachout Challenge team of volunteers visit organisations to share their experiences of living with mental illness.

We challenge organisations in their approach to supporting staff mental health and wellbeing. We encourage staff to talk about their mental health without shame or embarrassment.

We raise awareness and fight stigma around mental health, by educating the organisations we work with to be better equipped to support staff with their mental health. We can help employers to understand mental health and provide staff with a safe space to express their stress and anxieties, and the impact this can have on working life.

The Open Forum has been running for over 20 years, providing a space for the mental health community to come together and discuss Croydon's health services.

The forum gives people affected by mental health a safe place and a chance to voice concerns about health services to commissioners. These include the **South West London Integrated Care Board (SWL ICB)**, Croydon Council, and service providers such as **South London and Maudsley (SLaM)** and organisations from the voluntary sector.

Our monthly forums enable service users to have face-to-face discussions with commissioners and be a constructive voice in the commissioning and design of services. People are able to share their experiences and feed back directly to providers of mental health services.

Guest speakers and topics for discussion are suggested and chosen by service users.
